2nd Festival Valloire baroque August 2 to 11 - 2011 Baroque music, from Italy to Germany!

The Festival Valloire baroque, building on the success of its 1st season in 2010, proposes a rich programme for 2011. Concerts will be given in the remarkable baroque church of Valloire (Savoie, France). The festival is an invitation to new ways of listening and living classical music.

Programme: density and international class

The festival will welcome well-known talents like the violonist **Amandine Beyer** who will play the Sonatas et Partitas by Bach. She will also perform her Rosenmüller program « Beatus Vir ?" with her ensemble **Gli Incogniti**. Other great interprets will be, among others, **Jan de Winne** and **Marcel Ponseele** in recital and with the ensemble **II Gardellino**. **La Chapelle Rhénane**, conducted by **Benoît Haller**, will present *Tthe Vespers by Monteverdi*. Not to forget the *Fiori musicali* with **Les Meslanges** nor the Stradella opera *Il Barcheggio* with **La Compagnie du Globe**.

From baroque Italy to Germany

Gaël de Kerret, Artistic Director, states about the 2011 programme: « Italian composers used to play in German courts. Therefore, German composers were trained "à l'italienne". Like Schütz, educated by Gabrieli and Monteverdi, or Rosenmüller whose creations in chamber music were huge ».

Concerts in a splendid church

The festival in Valloire will value the rich baroque architecture of this village in Maurienne – French Alps. Concerts and meetings will take place in church Notre-Dame de l'Assomption, remarkable example of the baroque found in Savoie; chapels in hamlets will also be sites for the festival.

A new way of living classical music

The festival will offer eclectic activities such as concerts for young public, performances in the evening in the church, and « musical Proms ». The Proms, now tied to the image of the Festival Valloire baroque, are an arrangement of short concerts and a pic-nic in « intimacy » with the musicians, walks in the mountain and talks « libre-cours » about music or architecture.

The festival will remain anchored to its funding values « appeal for effort and jubilation, two sides of happiness found equally in mountain walk and in classical music »

In addition, Gaël de Kerret, will lead, in the frame of the festival, a Master Class of Soloist singing, to conclude with a concert by the trainees.

Playful and pedagogic animations

Musical divertimentos in Valloire and in its hamlets will enable the discovery of curious old instruments like baroque violin, hurdy-gurdy, bagpipe, fife, accompanied by dancers.
